

# SHORT WALK AROUND PART OF THE VILLAGE

*Easy walk - a little under 2 miles*

Start at the village green by the church. Note, but do not cross, the present bridge to the main road, which replaces a ford of bygone years.

Walk to the west down Church Lane and Newberry Lane. You might see squirrels and birds on the wall. Cross the A359 with care, turn right over the stream, walk to the corner and turn left into Little Marston Road. After about 20 metres turn right into a signposted footpath which follows a ditch and leads to a stile. Cross the stile, turn right and follow the hedge along the back of the farm. Mushrooms may be found in this field in Autumn. In the corner of the field, cross the stile into a cider orchard. Follow the hedge straight across the orchard into a lane via a kissing gate and coming out into Camel Street. Cross over, turn left for about 30 metres then right into Dampier Lane (waymarked).

Walk up the lane to a signpost at the end (to Sutton Montis). Go through the house wicket gate, follow waymark on the right, around the lawn to a kissing gate into the field and walk straight on eastwards along the hedge to the stile to the next field, where the hedge on the left has very good blackberries in the Autumn. Continue on the path eastwards behind Garston Farm to the next stile. Sometimes deer can be seen in these fields.

Continue through the field to a gap in the hedge into Watts Lane. Turn right and through the gate into Rimplon Road. Turn right and passing Perry's Recycling and Bragg Croft, turn left into the marked lane just before the Red Lion.

Go through the kissing gate into the field behind the pub and follow the footpath to the kissing gate and bridge over the stream. Turn right and walk straight ahead and over the stile onto a track. You will pass an old water pump on the left and you may hear trains from the nearby railway. At the end of this track there is a small pond on the right.

Turn right here into Garston Lane proper. Continue down the lane, passing the Moat Field on the right, to the church and Village Green, where you will find a seat to rest. This was provided by the W.I. to mark their fiftieth year.
