FROM THE BENEFICE July 2024

Dear Friends,

As I write, we have just passed the Summer Solstice. It was at 8.51pm on 20th June this year. I have lived to a ripe old age without realising that the date and time varies from year to year. Next year it will be on 21st, but it can be as late as 22nd. On 20th June, while some folk in Mudford were enjoying a delicious Midsummer Strawberry Tea, there was a very different sort of celebration in Rimpton, as the church was packed with those gathering to say farewell to our dear friend, of indomitable spirit, John Spencer. It was a celebration of a life well lived, and it was just as he wanted it to be. John was well known and much admired for his intellect, his faith and his tireless service to God, the church and the community. Indeed, he often contributed fascinating articles to this magazine.

The sun shone brightly on both occasions, as we all enjoyed a spell of lovely summer weather, a welcome relief after weeks of low temperatures, rain and wind. Everyone knows that a bit of sunshine brightens the spirits; apparently, it increases the release of the hormone serotonin, boosting mood and helping us to stay calm and focused. Also, it plays a vital role in our bodies' production of vitamin D, essential for our health. The sun's crucial role in the daily, seasonal and annual rhythms of life on earth has been recognised for millennia. No wonder many cultures, past and present, have worshipped the Sun as a deity. After all, the Sun can be seen as the source of light and life, and in a physical sense that is true.

The Old Testament prophet, Malachi, predicted a coming judgement for evildoers, but added, '... for you who revere my name, the sun of righteousness will rise with healing in its rays. And you will go out and frolic like well-fed calves.' I love that image. When I lived next to a working farm, I remember how joyful the moment was when the cattle were let out into the field after a winter inside. Like many commentators, Charles Wesley interpreted the Sun of Righteousness to be none other than Jesus Christ, the Son of God. This is clear in his great hymn, 'Christ whose glory fills the skies', in which he calls Christ 'the true and only light', who as Sun of Righteousness will 'triumph o'er the shades of night', 'pierce the gloom of sin and grief' and 'glad [his] eyes, and warm [his] heart.' What a wonderful image! Jesus Christ is the source of light and life. Only he can fill us with 'radiancy divine', bring us true joy so that we can go out and frolic like well-fed calves.'

RE-CYCLING IS NOW EVERY FRIDAY in both Marston Magna and Rimpton from 6 a.m. on Fridays 5th, 12th, 19th, and 26th July. Garden Wheelie Bin Collections are collected from 6 a.m., on Thursdays the 4th and 18th July. Refuse bins will be collected once every three weeks and the next one is on Friday 12th July.

This all does depend upon available staff and there are delays at present, caused by staff shortages. Recycling Centres are open for winter times.

<u>Bishop of Bath & Wells.</u> A richness of ministry

If we're all alike we tend to think the same. This can be comfortable and reassuring - 'Everyone around here sees things just like I do'. But it doesn't help us think out of the box or worse, spot risks and dangers of which we're unaware - 'Crumbs, we never saw that one coming!'. For this reason, companies and all kinds of organisations are seeking to become more diverse. Having differing viewpoints, skills and abilities is increasingly recognised to grow ability to think not only more widely but more effectively too.

Recognising diversity has been very much part of our life here in our Diocese of Bath & Wells during recent weeks. Back in May we acclaimed the 30th anniversary of the ordination of women to the priesthood. It's almost impossible now to imagine what our Church would be like without the contribution of women throughout the ordained ministry. At the end of June, the 'Celebration of Lay Ministries' held at St Paul's in Weston-Super-Mare saw us affirm, thank and bless the many different roles and responsibilities that lay people are undertaking across our churches and in local communities - from leading worship to pastoral care, ministry with children and young people to preaching and teaching the faith. Again, it's almost impossible to imagine what our churches would be like without such richness.

Our hope is that the diversity we've been honouring will only flourish and grow. For it's essential if we're to bring the light of the Gospel to everyone in our communities — and especially those we find hard to connect with. For none of us alone, either individually or as a group, has the ability to reach everyone. All of us are needed. It's for this reason that one of the priorities we're commending across our diocese is 'shared local ministry'. This recognizes that everyone, everywhere, has a contribution to make. Now surely that's something to celebrate!

THE RAIN REPORT (May)

May was a very wet month, being the wettest this year, with rainfall totalling 142 mms (5 ½ inches), well over double the May average of

58 mms (2½ inches). This was the wettest May I have recorded since my records began in 1991. The previous wettest being 2021 with 125 mms (5 Inches). There were 16 days with measurable rain falling, which is not unusual, but the big total was caused by several thunderstorms with very heavy rainfall in a short time. The wettest of these was the early hours of Thursday May 2nd with 30 mms (1½ inches) falling.

The dryest May I have ever recorded was 2020 with a tiny 5.5 mms (1/4 inch).

Diocese News in brief

Youthful bell ringing

An 11-year-old schoolgirl from Locking has become one of the youngest elected members of a bell ringers association in the country. Sophie Taylor, who rings the bells at Locking Church, near Westonsuper-Mare, discovered her passion for bell ringing a year ago, inspired by her father, James.

Sophie shared, "I became interested after my dad stared bell ringing. I found it fascinating, and I loved the history. So, I asked him if I could have a go and after I tried it, I fell in love with ringing."

Church welcomes Indian congregation

Around 100 people came together at St James's Church, Yeovil recently for the first gathering of Mar Thoma Church, a reformed Orthodox Christian denomination, rooted in the province of Kerala, India. Some members of the church in the Yeovil area were looking for a place to hold regular worship and approached St James'.

Mark Felstead, lay worship assistant at St James, said, "We have been feeling that God is bringing together more people from different cultural backgrounds. This was a wonderful opportunity, warmly welcomed by our vicar, the Revd. David Keen and Bishop Michael, for which the Mar Thoma expressed their enormous gratitude."

Church Tent at Bath and West Show

The Church Tent returned to the Bath and West Show last month, with a Caring for Creation theme. Visitors to the tent were able to access resources and speak to Sara and Dan from the diocesan environment team to find out how we can care for creation. The tent was staffed by volunteers from local churches who offered free tea and coffee to visitors. There was a drawing wall where people could post their prayers, Bible Chat mats to colour in, as well as a large version, created by the Revd Andy Gray, to explore and enjoy.

A time to celebrate

What a joy it is to come together to celebrate. Wedding season is upon us and across Bath and Wells this summer, churches will be the scene of couples pledging their lives to one another. But it also a time for us to celebrate those who minister in the church, both our ordained ministers and those who minister in other ways.

In June, colleagues, family and friends came together for the ordination of our new deacons and priests at Wells Cathedral. St Paul's Weston-Super-Mare was the venue for our Celebration of Lay Ministries service which saw people from across the diocese come together to give thanks for all that lay people give to the life of the church and to their community.

In May, many of our women priests, past and present, came together to mark the 30th anniversary of the ordination of women priests. Our PCCs and Treasurers have also been coming together at Wells Cathedral for an Evensong with Bishop Michael, followed by refreshments at the Bishop's Palace. "These are all special occasions and an important reminder of how we all serve our God and His Church in a host of ways. In Bath and Wells we are blessed with the gifts of so many people - from those who lead, including ordained ministers, Readers and those who serve in other ways, from mowing the churchyard, to serving refreshments. Our church life is richer for all these gifts, and it is important that we take time to cherish them and nurture them as we seek to grow our church and transform our communities together."
