Dear Friends

WITH YOU IN SPIRIT!

Have you ever excused yourself from an invitation to some event, saying "But, I'll be with you in spirit"? It is the sort of social pleasantry that we may trot out without thinking too much about it. But of course, it can be literally true. We are spiritual beings. In the fullness of our humanity, we are body, mind, soul, and spirit. And we can relate to one another on all those levels. We shake hands, lend a helping hand, hug and kiss. We share our thoughts and feelings, our knowledge, insights, and wisdom (such as it is).

We are very used to the relationship of bodies and minds. Souls and spirit are more of a mystery. But you may have been conscious of being aware of another person, being *en rapport*, in a deeper way that may not have to do with our everyday behaviour and more ordinary thoughts and feelings. This can happen with any other person. Sometimes, we think of some special people as 'soul friends', because we have that deeper sense of relationship with them.

But the deepest and most mysterious bond between all of us is the bond of the spirit. It is an 'ineffable' bond – sacred, beyond words. When we pray for someone, we are with them in spirit. And whenever we are in relationship with another person or have them in mind, we can be with them in spirit. It is the presence in us of what Christians call 'the Holy Spirit'; the presence in us of that which all great faiths recognise as the divine. It is the presence of the God, 'in whom we live, and move, and have our being' within every one of us.

For Christians, it is the gift that Jesus promised his disciples would be their 'comforter' after his death – theirs then, and ours now, and for all people for all time. It is the one sure constant of our shared humanity. And it unites us more completely than the most intimate relationship of body, mind, or soul.

RE-CYCLING IS NOW EVERY TUESDAY in Marston Magna from 6 a.m. on Tuesdays 4th, 11th, 18th, and 25th June. <u>Garden Wheelie Bin</u> Collections are collected from 6 a.m., on Thursdays the 6th and 20th June. <u>Refuse bins</u> will be collected once every three weeks and the next one is on Tuesday 18th June.

RE-CYCLING IS NOW EVERY FRIDAY in Rimpton from 6 a.m. on Fridays 1st, 7th, 14th, 21st and 28th June. Garden Wheelie Bin Collections are being collected from 6 a.m., on Thursdays 6th and 20th June. Refuse bins will be collected once every three weeks and the next one will be on Friday 14th June.

This all does depend upon available staff and there are delays at present, caused by staff shortages. Recycling Centres are open for winter times.

Letter from Toby Wright, who will be installed as the Dean of Wells on Saturday, 16 June "The gift of prayer"

It is a great joy and privilege to come and join you here in Bath and Wells as the new Dean of Wells, to serve the Cathedral, the diocese, and the county. This is an area with strong links on my maternal side, with my grandparents being married in Bath, and many relatives from around this patch.

One of the many things which drew me to this role is the privilege of prayer in your beautiful Cathedral Church. Each morning, we gather and pray for the life of the diocese and give thanks for that same life in the evening. Please be assured of my prayers for you in your mission and ministry and I warmly look forward to getting out to explore the diocese.

As I reflect on this time of change, I am mindful of the importance of finding patterns of prayer to sustain our lives and nourish our spiritual growth. As Archbishop Desmond Tutu said many years ago, we must 'think of prayer as a relationship.' We are to invest in it, and to find space so that it can develop, and this takes time. Or as the mystic Evelyn Underhill put it, 'On every level of life, from housework to heights of prayer, in all judgement and efforts to get things done, hurry and impatience are sure marks of the amateur.'

We all know the importance of taking time to invest in relationships, and I love the challenge that hurry, and impatience are sure marks of the amateur. As we reflect on our own prayer lives, I wonder if there are ways that we can deepen our relationship in prayer?

The Christian tradition is packed with ways to help people learn to pray. Maybe we can find ways to slow ourselves down and be more present to the gift of prayer, so that we may join in the Apostle Paul's prayer, 'we have not ceased to pray for you, asking that you may be filled with the knowledge of God's will in all spiritual wisdom and understanding'. THE RAIN REPORT (February)

April, as is traditional, was a showery month. There was some rain on 16 days of the month. 11 of these days recorded just 3 mms (1/8 inch) or less. The other 5 days recorded between 7mms (¼ inch) and 11 mms (½ inch), making the total for the month 66.5 mms (2½ inches), just above the April average of 59 mms (2½ inches).

Over the last 34 years, there have been some big variation in April rainfall. 2012 was the third wettest month I have recorded with 170 mms (6¾ inches) and April 2007 the dryest month I have ever recorded with just 3 mms (1/8 inch).

Bishop Michael says, "As churches we pray in and for our communities each and every day, but for this diocesan day of prayer I am encouraging every church to look afresh at the communities we serve and the multitude of ways we can and do pray for them. As well as being an opportunity to help us seek God's transformation for the communities we are a part of, I hope this will provide us with a chance to deepen our own faith and strengthen our church communities through prayer.

"I am always struck by how many people, even if they are not regular churchgoers, are pleased that they are being prayed for, and so this may be an opportunity to let our communities know that we are praying for our life together and how it might be transformed for good, as well as giving thanks for all that is good already."

As well as the gatherings across Bath and Wells, there will be resources and suggestions for more local prayer gatherings, on that day, and into the future.

Want to be part of an Outstanding volunteer service? Then Route1 is looking for you!

Route1 Advocacy and Independent Visitors service supports children and young people who are in care or have a social worker. They do this by matching volunteers with young people as either short term Advocates, or longer-term Independent Visitors.

The service recently had an independent internal review and was graded as Outstanding; and was shortlisted to the final 3 in the Frontline National Award 2024 'Team of the Year'.

Route1 helps children have happy childhood memories, and ensures their views are listened to and acted upon.

Independent Visitors: These volunteers make a long-term commitment to one child in care. They visit the child once or twice each month to build a trusting, supportive relationship and friendship that can sometimes last many years. This can bring lifechanging experiences and opportunities to a child or young person – and their Independent Visitor!

Advocates: volunteers work alongside individual children to ensure their voices are heard, and their wishes and feelings are considered when decisions are being made which affect them. Each child's support is usually short term and there is no expectation of a long-term commitment to any particular child.

A recent trainee volunteer said, "I started out thinking 'what on earth can require 5 days of training?' I now know why and think you have it just right." Your life experience will be highly valued, and you will be trained and supported in developing key skills. Your volunteering can be arranged to suit your availability.

Marston Magna & Rimpton WI Report for May 2024

The WI Meeting this month had an interesting debate when the Resolution for the National Federation's AGM was discussed. The Resolution being put forward is:

"There is a chronic shortage of NHS Dentists and people are suffering health issues as a result. The NFWI calls on the Government to increase investment in the training and retention of dentists and to review the current inadequate NHS contracts in order to ensure everyone can access an NHS dentist wherever they live."
