Dear Friends

As we open our curtains in the morning and look around the countryside, we realise we are in 'the season of mists and mellow fruitfulness' At our annual flower and produce show, we witnessed colourful selections of fruit, vegetables and flowers, which displayed not only the skill of our gardeners, but also the fertility of the soil. In church we have been celebrating our harvest thanksgivings and in the village halls, harvest suppers are always a special occasion to gather together for a delicious meal, with friends and neighbours.

So why do we celebrate harvest? From Old Testament times God's people were encouraged to bring the first fruits of the harvest as an offering to God and then they were to be distributed not just amongst themselves, but among those who were needy around them. Diocese News in brief

24-hour Wave of Praver

For 24 hours, a wave of prayer spread across the Diocese of Bath and Wells, as people came together to pray for the growth of church and the transformation of their communities. Events took place right across Somerset, from intimate prayer gatherings in homes and churches to outdoor events and online prayer walls. The Archbishop of Canterbury joined the wave travelling from Bath to Wells, then on to Bridgwater, Nailsea and Frome. He met and prayed with young people, farmers in an agricultural market, he met church communities and shared in prayer with them, and he opened a newly created prayer space. Elsewhere churches held their own events as they came together in prayer with and for their communities.

A place to pray

A former gardener's shed has been converted into a 24-hour prayer space at St Mary's Church in Frome. It is part of overall plans to establish a prayerful community around the and in the old vicarage. A growing community meets fortnightly to explore different approaches to prayer - Ignatian, Taize, Centering, Northumbrian and others. The Prayer Shed, officially opened by Archbishop Justin, will be available for prayer 24 hours a day.

Highlighting the issues of modern slavery through art.

The Lord Lieutenant of Somerset, Mohammed Saddiq, is to open an art exhibition organised by Hidden Voices Bridgwater at Taunton Minster on 18 October to mark Anti-Slavery Day. The exhibition runs from 18 - 23 October. On 20 October Bishop Michael will speak at Evensong at the Minster. Local artists have donated works for the exhibition that illustrate the realities of modern slavery. It's hoped the power of art will help convey the urgent and often hidden nature of this human crisis.

RE-CYCLING IS NOW EVERY FRIDAY in both Marston Magna and Rimpton from 6 a.m. on Fridays 4th, 11th 18th and 25th October. Garden Wheelie Bin Collections are collected from 6 a.m., on Thursdays the 10th and 24th October. Refuse bins will be collected once every three weeks and the next one is on 4th and 25th October.

This all does depend upon available staff and there are delays at present, caused by staff shortages. Recycling Centres are open for winter times.

Letter from Bishop Trevor Willmott Assistant Bishop for the Diocese of Bath and Wells A light which shines in the darkness

The custodial sentences imposed on many of those involved in the recent riots in communities across country our highlighted, yet again, the issue of criminal justice and the pressures and strains within the prison system. The seemingly ever-increasing size of the prison population; the appalling conditions within many of our older prisons, especially those in our inner cities; the almost total lack of provision for education and rehabilitation and an apparent unwillingness by those elected to Parliament to consider whether the whole of our justice system needs a radical overhaul have all resulted in much media comment.

But one part of the prison system which has not been mentioned is the invaluable role played by those who serve as Chaplains. Prison and restorative justice have been a constant thread almost throughout the whole of my life beginning with my first visit, while still in my teens to what was then called a Borstal.

Since then, I've had the privilege of working with chaplaincy teams across the whole of the prison estate. I've witnessed at first hand the extraordinary work done those teams, lay and ordained, of all faiths, working together to witness to God's love in Christ and caring for all those in the prison system, both staff and prisoners. I've often said to those on the outside, if you want to know what true collaborative ministry looks like in practice, look no further than a chaplaincy team. While each member remains true to his or her particular faith, the barriers which often divide people of faith have no part in that shared work of witness and service.

Sadly, all too often, the work of Chaplaincies not just in prison but in all aspects of our human life, in education, hospital, mental health, care homes and many other places, is barely known – that is, until we need their care. But Chaplaincies are the yeast which leaven our society. The light which shines in the darkness. Society, as we long and pray for it to be, would be the poorer without them.

THE RAIN REPORT (August)

August rainfall totalled 40.5 mms (1½ Inches), with 8 wet days, well below the average of 69 mms (2¾ Inches). The first 3 weeks of the month were quite dry with just 11 mms (½ inch) and 4 wet days. It would have been an exceptionally dry month, but for Saturday 24th when more than half of the months rain, 23.5 mms (1 inch) fell in one day.

The dryest August I have recorded was 2022, with 15 mms (½ inch) and the wettest 1997 with 167.5 mms (6½ inches).

With 2 thirds of the year gone, it's looking like it might finish up a fairly wet year. Rainfall to date has been 639 mms (25 inches) well above the average for this period of 510 mms (20 inches). Traditionally the autumn months October, November and December are the wettest months of the year, so we might be heading for a total above 1,000 mms (39 inches). There has only been 5 of these in the last 32 years. But who knows? Certainly not myself.
