Dear all,

I'm writing this on the day after the death of Pope Francis. The bells in our churches were tolled 88 times, once for each year of his life.

Pope Francis will be remembered as a humble leader, concerned about the poor in society more than about the trappings of his office. In my newspaper this morning there's a cartoon showing the gates of heaven, with clouds of glory and angels sounding their trumpets – the golden gates stand wide open, but the humble figure of Francis is walking quietly in through a side gate labelled "Servants' Entrance".

I've chosen this month's Memory Verse with Pope Francis very much in mind. On one occasion, Jesus's disciples were arguing among themselves about who was the most important. Jesus rebuked them. Here's the verse:

Jesus said, "Whoever wants to be great among you must be your servant." (Mark 10:43)

After that, Jesus went on to say that he himself was their example – he had not come to be served, but to serve. You may remember that these were the first words spoken by King Charles at his coronation. It's a fine attitude not just for people in power, but for all of us, and anyone who correctly recites the verse to me will receive the usual sweet (or pint, should you be lucky enough to meet me in the pub). Of course, reciting it is one thing; putting into practice is quite another! But let's do our best, following the example of Pope Francis, and of the one whose example he followed, Jesus himself.

Garden Wheelie Bin Collections are collected from 6 a.m., on Thursdays the 8th and 22nd May. Refuse bins will be collected once every three weeks and the next one is on 2nd and then the 23rd May.

This all does depend upon available staff. Recycling Sites have moved to their summer opening hours from Tuesday 1 April. All sites will remain open from 9am to 4pm on weekends. Midweek, sites will be open from 9am to 6pm. Opening days vary from site to site, check online before you visit

<u>Bishop of Bath & Wells</u> It's sowing time!

It's sowing time! My greenhouse is currently full of seedlings pushing their way towards the light. Soon all this new life will be big enough to be planted out into the garden. Peas and courgettes, dahlias and zinnias; all ready to grow, blossom and be fruitful.

It's not only seedlings that grow. Churches do too! Just like all that's happening in my greenhouse, this doesn't happen by accident. Evidence shows that churches are most likely to grow when they plan and prepare for this to happen. Church growth is intentional.

This article of Manna contains stories about how churches in our Diocese have planned for growth and of the fruit they're seeing as a result. There's no 'one size fits all' for how this has happened. Just as in our gardens, what grows in one place won't necessarily thrive in another.

Important as planning and preparing may be, these things aren't the vital ingredient for growth. Growth comes when God is alive and at work within us and our churches. In his first letter to church he's helped establish in Corinth, St Paul also uses a gardening metaphor to describe the growth he's seeing. Paul says, 'I planted, Apollos [Paul's co-worker] watered, but God gave the growth.' (1 Cor 3:6).

Without God's input, any plans we have to grow our churches will be little more than strategy, our efforts like those of ants running frantically to and fro. This is why our prayer for growth is essential. Prayer invites God to give us wisdom about what to do. It opens our treasure stores to resource the plans we want to put in place. It asks God to go before us to touch the hearts and minds of those we'd like to reach. It invites God to bless and prosper the work we do.

So be inspired! The accounts contained in this edition of Manna show what can happen when we ask God to grow our churches, offering God our prayer, our faith, our effort and our trust. Let the sowing time begin!

THE RAIN REPORT (March 2025)

March was a very dry month and set a new record for the dryest March I have recorded with just 3 days with some measurable rainfall totalling 8.5mms (¼ inch), only a fraction of the March average of 61mms (2½ inches). The previous dryest March on my records going back to 1991 was 2011 with 20.5mms (¾ inch). Since 1991 there have only been 4 dryer months. April 2007 was the dryest with just 3 mms (1/8inch).

In my experience things tend to average out. So perhaps a wet summer is looming. We shall see.

Diocese News in brief

Church clock restoration

Experts now believe the clock at St Catherine's Church, Montacute, could date back to the 1400s, making it one of the oldest working timepieces in the country. Watched by the local community and children from the village school, it was removed for restoration. On hand to help was 93-year-old Humphrey Hamlin, who had wound the clock for many years and restored it himself in 1987. A fundraising effort is now underway to support its repair and to create an exhibition space in the church. A rededication service is planned for summer 2025.

Baptisms with a difference

Three baptisms took place in a local stream in the Benefice of Cheddar and Rodney Stoke. Associate Priest, Revd Thea Oliver baptised a mother and her two sons aged 11 and 12 in the stream that runs through the village of Rodney Stoke.

Family and friends gathered on the banks of the river to join in prayer and celebration. Thea said, "It was a wonderfully moving service."

Marston Magna & Rimpton Gardening Club SAVE THE DATE

Spring has definitely shown that it is here with some glorious days of sunshine in recent weeks. More time to be spent outdoors and time to get planning and planting in preparation for this year's *Annual Flower* and *Produce Show* hosted by the Marston Magna and Rimpton Gardening Club which takes place on *SATURDAY 16TH AUGUST 2025*.

Entry forms and a booklet with rules, along with hints and tips, are now available in both village halls and churches (a small number of large print copies will be available). We have our usual vegetable, fruit and flower classes, but we have scaled back the classes in each to ensure that we are looking for seasonal produce. We have some exciting classes within the other sections which include a table arrangement "In Celebration of VE Day" from Flower Arrangements. Cheese scones and bread feature in Home Baking and Preserves with a special class for men only which asks them to bake a chocolate cake!! Star bakers will be keen to enter the Victoria sponge class which asks that everyone uses the same ingredients. If Art and Crafts are more your forte, then how about a painting or drawing of your garden, or pick up your knitting needles/crochet hooks and make a beautiful baby blanket? Finally, we would really like to see more children entering the Children's Section which is now split into two age groups to facilitate fairer judging - aged 7 & under and 8 - 11 year olds; we have simplified the section down to two classes only, one is to design a

poster on the theme of Flowers and the other is to decorate two gingerbread pieces, that may either be purchased from a supermarket or made at home with an adult, with the decoration entirely by the child.

170g/ 6oz butter, softened 170g/ 6 oz caster sugar 170g/ 6 oz self-raising flour, sifted 1 tsp baking powder 3 eggs 45ml/3 tbsp jam 60ml/4 tbsp double cream Caster sugar for dusting

Drought: weather immediately following planting.

Hoeing: manual method of severing roots from stems of newly planted flowers and vegetables.

House Plant: a much better idea.

Mother Earth: deep mud.

Onion sets: small onions planted in soil one day and transferred elsewhere by birds the next.

Perennial: plant that dies in first year of planting (see annual)

method Propagation: of increasing plant populations, normally effective only with weeds.

Rockery: what the builder left behind.

Self-sufficiency gardening: a method of growing vast supplies of the kind of vegetables you would never normally eat.

Soft fruit: bird sanctuary.
